Approximately 17% of newly registered nurses leave the profession within the first year of practice. Moral distress, defined as feeling constrained from action upon one's ethical knowing, contributes to this nursing attrition dilemma. This session presents moral distress research findings among students and novice post-licensure nurses. Professor Krautscheid will discuss education recommendations promoting resilience-protective factors.
