The Oregon Board of Psychology is the state licensure and ethics board for Oregon, whose aim is promoting, preserving, and protecting the public health and welfare of Oregonians by ensuring the ethical and legal practice of psychology. Duties include bi-monthly review of 1500 pages of investigation, communications, and legal notices related to ethical complaints submitted to the board. Full-day board meetings for discussion, deliberation, and decision-making are bi-monthly. Annual attendance and participation with Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards national meetings is also involved. This service on the board also includes membership on the Education Committee, which reviews continuing education requirements and the educational qualifications of incoming applicants for licensure. Education Committee Meetings are monthly. In May, 2019, was elected to leadership team, with a trajectory to advance in board leadership positions.
